#### **TOPICS**

We invite scholars, practitioners, and policymakers to explore the critical role of sustainable finance in addressing climate risk and advancing resilience in an increasingly uncertain

global environment. Contributions examining integrated pathways through which financial systems, institutions, and markets can manage climate-related risks, foster innovation, and support resilient and sustainable development are particularly encouraged. Interdisciplinary approaches connecting finance with policy, technology, and governance are also welcome. The main topics of the conference include, but are not limited to:

- Integrated climate-finance risk management frameworks
- Blended finance for climate adaptation and resilience projects
- Role of central banks and regulators in climate risk supervision
- Climate risk pricing, asset valuation, and portfolio allocation under uncertainty
- Climate stress testing and scenario analysis in banking and capital markets

- Fintech and digital finance solutions for sustainable development

- **Language:** All submissions must be written in English.
- **Manuscript requirements:** Submitted papers must comply with the conference's scope and formatting guidelines. The length of each paper should not exceed 7,000 words (including tables, figures, references, and appendices).

All manuscripts will undergo a blind peer-review process prior to acceptance.

- **Publication:** Accepted papers will be published in the Conference Proceedings (with ISBN).

**Cover Page** (separate file) must include:

- Full name(s) and academic title(s) of author(s)
- Affiliation(s) in English and Vietnamese
- Address and contact information (email, phone number)

# ARTICLE TITLE

The manuscript should begin with an indented and italicized abstract of approximately 100–200 words, clearly presenting the research objectives, methodology, data, and main findings.

**Keywords:** Provide 3–5 keywords in alphabetical order.

1. Introduction
2. Literature Review/ Theoretical Framework and Methodology
3. Results and Discussion
4. Conclusions and Policy Implications
5. References

## Citation and References

In-text citations should follow the APA style (e.g., Herzer, 2013). Endnotes should be kept to a minimum, indicated by superscript numbers in the text, and placed at the end of the manuscript.

A complete list of references, arranged in alphabetical order, should be provided at the end of the manuscript.

## Formatting Requirements

- A separate cover page must include full author details (name, affiliation, contact information, and total word count).
- The manuscript file must be anonymized (no author identification) for blind peer review.
- Manuscripts must be written in English using Microsoft Word, Times New Roman, font size 12, with 1.5 line spacing.
- The length of the manuscript should not exceed 7,000 words (including tables, figures, references, and appendices).

## **Layout and Style**

- The title should be bold and centered.
- Section headings should be bold, left-aligned, and numbered using Arabic numerals.
- First-level subheadings (e.g., 2.1) should be bold and italicized.
- Second-level subheadings (e.g., 2.1.1) should be italicized only.
- All pages should be numbered consecutively.

## **Tables and Figures**

- Tables and figures should be numbered separately and sequentially.
- Each table and figure must have a clear and descriptive title.
- Captions should be placed above tables and below figures.
- Figures must be of high quality and resolution.
